### CHANGES. . . CHANGES. . . CHANGES Welcoming the Roman Missal Third Edition III

Dear Parish Family,

After taking a look at the outline for the Eucharistic Celebration, now I would like to invite you to go through each one of the parts of the Mass and its sections, to see what all the revisions for the texts are about.

#### **Part I. The Introductory Rites**

Even though some of the words we hear and say at Mass are undergoing a revision as far as the translation is concerned, the flow of the Mass is not changing at all. The outline of the Mass, as we know it, will remain the same; *Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, and Concluding Rites*. In each part many of the words will not change, it is only a few words in each part that will experience the new translation.

In this article we will focus on the *Introductory Rites*, which includes everything from the moment you stand for the entrance song and procession, until we all sit to listen to the proclamation of God's Word.

**I.I. *Entrance Antiphon or Song***; Mass begins with the entrance song. In some instances during the weekday Masses the entrance song is replaced by the *antiphon* which everyone reads. The *antiphon* usually corresponds and relates to the season of the year, saint's day, or some other event, belief, or intention that focuses on the reason why we pray on a given day. The song for the entrance procession is **not** undergoing revision. However the antiphon, when used, you will experience a new translation for it.

**I.II. *Greeting***; as for the Sign of the Cross and the answer of the "Amen" there is no change.

As for the greeting "*The Lord be with you*", those words are not changing. However, the answer you respond with; "*And also with you*", will experience a revision in its text; the new answer is "***And with your spirit***," which comes from the Latin translation, "*Et cum spiritu tuo*," and at the same time it matches the major languages which already use it, including Spanish, French, Italian, and German.

The purpose of this greeting at the beginning of Mass is not just to say 'hello' or 'good morning', but it is supposed to alert us that we are entering a sacramental realm and remind us of our responsibility during this time that we will spend at prayer.

Both greeting and reply come from the Bible. "*The Lord be with you*" appears in Judges 6:12, Ruth 2:4,2 Chronicles 15:2, and Luke 1:28. It also comes from the promise Jesus made to his followers that He will be with them until the end of the world (Mat 28:20). In English when saying farewell we say 'goodbye', which actually comes from 'God be with you.'

The response "*And with you spirit*," comes from the conclusion of four New Testament Epistles: 2 Tim 4:22, Gal 6:18, Phil 4:23, and Phil 25. It is the address from Paul to the whole Christian Community.

"*The Lord be with you*", "*And with you spirit*," both express a desire that the Holy Spirit be present for the whole community. And since this dialogue is begun by the priest, who, through ordination, represents Christ at Mass, the response also affirms that the Holy Spirit has come to him in a special way. This dialogue establishes the interdependence of the priest and the people as we take up our roles to praise God.

The other two forms that the priest uses for the initial greeting have been varied almost unnoticeably; "*The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all*," from Cor 13:13 (NRSV). And "*Grace to you and peace from God Our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ*," from Rom 1:7 and 1 Cor 1:3 (NRSV).

The revised translation of the texts aims to root us more deeply in the scriptures. In the case of the greeting, it brings us into the language of Saint Paul.

Again, as we undergo revision of the texts for the Mass in its different parts; Let us pray to the Holy Spirit, may He who has been our companion since the founding of The Church, continue to guide us as we make our Eucharistic Celebrations more uplifting, richer in meaning through texts and symbols.


